Action for Walking

In African cities, walking is the primary mode of transport for the majority, with up to **78**% of people walking every day to access work, education, health care, markets, and public transport.

Until recently, walking, almost everywhere on the continent, received relatively minor policy attention and resource allocation. Walking infrastructure was lacking: most roads had no footpaths or crossings and were poorly signed and maintained. Walking was, for a billion people, difficult, unpleasant, and unsafe and it was children, the elderly, those with disabilities, women, and those with low incomes – who walk most – that disproportionately suffered.

More than 60% of the population in Africa live in low-income neighbourhoods often lacking access to basic services including water, electricity, and sanitation. But these neighbourhoods can also be very walkable.

Through urban development and transport investment the people of Africa need action for walking and great walkable streets and places.





About the Conference

This year our 23rd conference will take place in Kigali, Rwanda, the first Walk21 conference on the African continent.

The Walk21 International Conference series on Walking and Liveable Communities celebrates the work of our speakers and delegates on an international scale as well as promoting the international profile of walking. The international conference series aims to:
